It sprouted quickly because the soil was shallow; but when the sun had risen, the young plants were scorched; and since their roots were not deep, they dried up. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. But others fell into rich soil and produced grain, a hundred or sixty or thirty times as much as had been sown" (Matthew 13)

A man who sets his goals in simplicity and satisfaction of life, will limit his worldly desires and strive for inner peace and lasting happiness. This happiness can be found in wholeness and in the power of the divine. The Divine is love. This love unites all beings in all of creation. Each of us can experience this love.
